## United Way as a National Service Partner

**United Way is a national network of nearly 1,300 local organizations** that work to advance the common good by focusing on education, income and health. These are the building blocks for a good life: a quality education that leads to a stable job, enough income to support a family through retirement, and good health.





# United Way as a National Service Partner

## Advancing the Common Good

**Education** – Helping Children and Youth Achieve Their Potential

**Income** – Promoting Financial Stability and Independence

**Health** – Improving People's Health

# United Way as a National Service Partner



## Advancing the Common Good With Real Outcomes: The Ten Year Goals

### Education –

Cut by half the number of young people who drop out of high school.

Income – Cut by half the number of working families that lack financial stability.

Health – Increase by one-third the percentage of healthy young people and adults.

#### Advocate

United Way encourages everyone to speak up about the things that matter most—education, health care, financial stability for working families. One of United Way’s top public policy efforts is an increase in the funding for the Corporation for National and Community Service.

### Volunteer

United Way saw a 4.7 percent increase in the number of people volunteering directly with United Way—1.1 million this year, up from 1.02 million last year. Additionally, United Way-supported Volunteer Center and online opportunities resulted in almost 10.8 million hours of service to strengthen local communities, up from 10.1 million last year.
